- 62% of O'Fallon households have at least one library card




A Place That Connects and Inspires

- 600+ families helped with their taxes



Why Now?

Master Plan Findings

Comprehensive study showed significant identified key challenges:

Children's area too small (collection & activity room)

Need more multipurpose space

Location may not suit city growth

More study rooms & seating needed

Poor acoustics

High demand for outdoor space



Possible Options


Option 1: Add On

- About \$12m for additional 6k sq ft
- Deemed not cost-effective
- Wouldn't fix location problem

Option 2: Build New


- Recommendation for 40k sq ft to meeting current and future needs
- Projected \$25m build using 2027/2028 dollars
